It is hoped that in the future, once Covid restrictions allow us to sit closer together, we could have occasional joint services at Bridgwater Drive. The **next 5th Sunday, is 31 Oct. at Christ Church and will be All Age, Café-Style, led jointly by Naomi and Sandy**. It is hoped that with a bit of planning, some folk from BDC could join us for that.


