On Thursday, (26th May) we had a good chat to Jackie Twiddell, our local Police Community Support Officer (PCSO), at our **Coffee with the Cops Morning.**







There was discussion about The Wildlife Garden on the Mendip Estate which was created about 10 years ago by The Community Group for the benefit of local residents (and the wildlife of course) which is no longer usable because of antisocial behaviour. We were shocked to hear about the cruel treatment of pond residents (fish and frogs) and the dumping of food and other rubbish leading to problems with rats. Another point raised was the use of the church car park by people not connected with the church – Jackie pointed out that if anything happens (like someone hitting another car) it is the driver's responsibility, not the church's.

Follow these steps:

1. Choose a few everyday objects you use, for example bucket, broom or water bottle. Change their purpose completely and allow your body to

- become an extension of this object. You could balance an object on a part of your body, hold it upside down between two limbs, or sit on it.
- 2. Once you have your object set up, (safely!) hold your pose or sculpture for one minute.
- 3. As you hold the pose for one minute, think about how you feel during this time. What do you become more aware about within your body and surroundings?
- 4. Capture your sculpture through a photograph or drawing. You could ask someone to take your photo while you're in position, or prop your phone or camera up so that you can take a photo of yourself holding your pose.
