TIPS & IDEAS – This week's challenge from #64MillionArtists involves thinking about the emptiness, the 'void' caused by suppressing emotions.

Do something this week that fills your 'cup'.

'We all spend time on things that make us who we are, some that bring us joy, some that are responsibilities - things that 'fill our cup'. Maybe right now your cup feels half full, full to the brim or it's overflowing. Some might say the empty space feels like a 'void' within us. If you identify empty space in your 'cup' - what does that look like and what would you like to do to fill it? If it's overflowing, how might you pour out some of what's inside to make space?

Psalm 23

...you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.

If the empty space or 'void' is feeling distant from a person, why not write them a card and send it to them to reconnect. Or if the empty space is spending time on yourself, take a moment to do something you love!' Do some gardening, or something creative, write a poem, make a collage...

Of course as Christians, Jesus and our faith fill our cup. Maybe reflect on that...

Or failing that, make some bunting for the Jubilee; make some scones or Coronation Chicken sandwiches...!
