NEWS - THE BRIDGWATER DRIVE CHURCH (from Margaret)

Our Church Meeting will be after worship this Sunday, 24 July, and will be the AGM. Please attend if you possibly can. Naomi's service will be a little shorter than usual and she promises that the meeting will be as short as possible, although, of course, there will time for people to voice their thoughts and opinions. This is a chance for everyone to be involved in the life of the church, looking back over the past year (our last meeting was in August last year!), hearing what the elders have been discussing and seeing what we, and they, might plan for the future. HARP – We have had a thank you letter from Lauren Collen at HARP for our donations. Lauren summarises some of the help HARP provides - not just housing up to 236 people at any one time (with more rooms available soon) but also giving advice, support and guidance to people on their housing situation (whether they are already homeless of not), helping people with complex needs such as mental illness, addiction and financial problems, helping rough sleepers ... etc

RNLI – I have also had thanks from Doris Banning who manages the shop on the end of the pier. She thanks us for our many donations via Betty's Pots (our donations of 5p and other coins have totalled over £200), also for Anne and Sarah's donation of their quiz prize money and for the sale of Carol's beautiful notecards (I still have some available at £4 a pack). Doris included some interesting news from the RNLI in her email.

The number of 'shouts' so far this year was 54 last week, but I know there have been another 6 or 7 since then. As usual, the busy seafront is keeping the crews busy.

The second pier train was named last week, and it is the William Bradley. He was the pier head lightkeeper from 1871 to 1891 and lived with his wife and daughters in a house at the head of the pier. He also received a silver medal from the RNLI for rescuing a man from the capsized steam tug, Jubilee, in 1887. Note from me – Gerry and I knew of a girl who attended Westcliff High School for Girls who lived on the end of the pier but I never knew her name. The history of the pier is fascinating.
