On Tuesday morning this week we watched 'The King and I' – selected democratically by those present! Another great musical that had us humming along. It brought back all sorts of memories and many thoughts that never occurred to me when I first watched it: -

When did Siam become Thailand? - It was renamed in 1939.

What was the historical background to the story? It is based on the novel by Margaret Landon, 'Anna and the King of Siam'

Is any of the history true? Yes - it is based on the lives of real people. The story takes place in the 1860s – I noticed many references to Queen Victoria and the dresses Anna wore were unbelievably huge!

The ideas about the equality of women and about subservience and slavery were much more important in the film than I realised as a teenager (the film was released in 1956). I wonder if these were added to the film for a 20th century audience watching at the time of the 'Civil Rights Movement' or if these themes ran through the original book?

Here is the text of 1 Corinthians 13 (NEV) followed by my word cloud based on this reading:

13 If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.

⁴Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

⁸ Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for

knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known.

¹³ So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love

News from our Guides, Brownies and Rainbows at The BDC from Sylv.


I just thought I would share that we had a fab evening last night at the Guideacres campsite in Benfleet.
